Thus before the gates of Notre Dame the scaffold for Esmeralda is fixed, where she perishes hanged before the eyes of Frollo, who admits to Quasimodo his joy at the death of the young woman. Shocked and furious by this fact, Quasimodo assassinates Frollo by pushing him from the tower of the cathedral.

As an epilogue, the hunchbacked Quasimodo goes to the open field where the corpses of the condemned lie and finds there the body of Esmeralda, which he embraces, remaining like that until he dies of hunger. Later, the Parisians open the tomb and find the skeletons. When they try to separate them, the hunchback's bones turn to dust.
